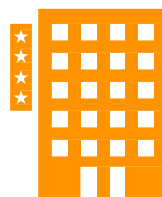
Think about:

- What are my strengths and interests?
- What types of jobs am I interested in?
- What are the courses that I can take to prepare for these jobs?

For example, if your interest is in service (e.g. helping others), you could consider a career in the hospitality sector.

Some of the courses that you can take to get started in the hospitality sector are:

- *Higher Nitec* in Hospitality Operations (3 years) (ITE)
- *Higher Nitec* in Hospitality Operations (2 years) (ITE)
- Diploma in Hospitality & Tourism Management (NYP, TP and RP)
- Diploma in Hotel & Leisure Management (RP)



Applying for courses through JAE and JIE 'O'

- What happens if I do not receive a posting?

To make the best use of your 12 JAE/JIE 'O' choices, be sure to find out more on subject-specific minimum entry requirements (MERs) and last aggregate score (if available).

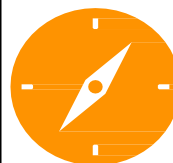
Making Informed Choices

You should appeal for courses where you meet the current year's last aggregate score, as well as the MERs. More information can be found on the JAE Appeals website.

During JAE Appeals

Check the outcome of your appeals through the JAE Appeals website, as well as through SMS notifications. You may also be given an alternative option, which is not one of your choices, and we encourage you to consider the offer carefully.

After this, you can still appeal directly to the polytechnics or ITE for courses that you are interested in. You can do this even if you have accepted the posting offered through the JAE Appeals.

- Can I still appeal for other courses after the JAE appeals?
