## **4 Independent Learning Days (ILD)**

Since 2021, Blended Learning has become a key feature of the schooling experience to further develop students' ability to be self-directed, passionate and life-long learners. Through Blended Learning, regularly scheduled Home-based Learning (HBL) Days will complement teaching and learning in schools. Students' learning during HBL Days will be supported by the National Digital Literacy Programme (NDLP) which will ensure that all secondary students will own a personal learning device (PLD). In Meridian Secondary, we called our HBL days Independent Learning Days (ILD) to remind students that on these days, they take ownership of their learning and they will exercise autonomy in the learning process.



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Independent Learning Days (ILD) will take place on even week Fridays and will allow students to manage their own learning and explore and pursue their interests from home. There will be a total of 8 ILDs in Semester 1. #### Activities during the ILD

4.1

Each ILD comprises curriculum tasks and Student-Initiated Learning (SIL) activities. Details of the curriculum tasks will be provided by subject teachers. SIL activities is an opportunity for students to engage in learning beyond the formal curriculum. Students are encouraged to explore their interests and passions as part of the ILD. The estimated timings serve as a guide for students to allocate their time appropriately. More details will be provided to students by their Form Teachers.

We seek parents'/guardians' support for the students' SIL activities. Students are expected to show their parents/guardians the proposal before starting the activity. The school would require parents/guardians to give consent for the student's chosen SIL activities in an upcoming message sent through Parent Gateway. ### **5.1 School Attire**

Students are to be in the day's Full/Half School Uniform by Flag Raising Ceremony **every morning**.

The school attire is as follows:

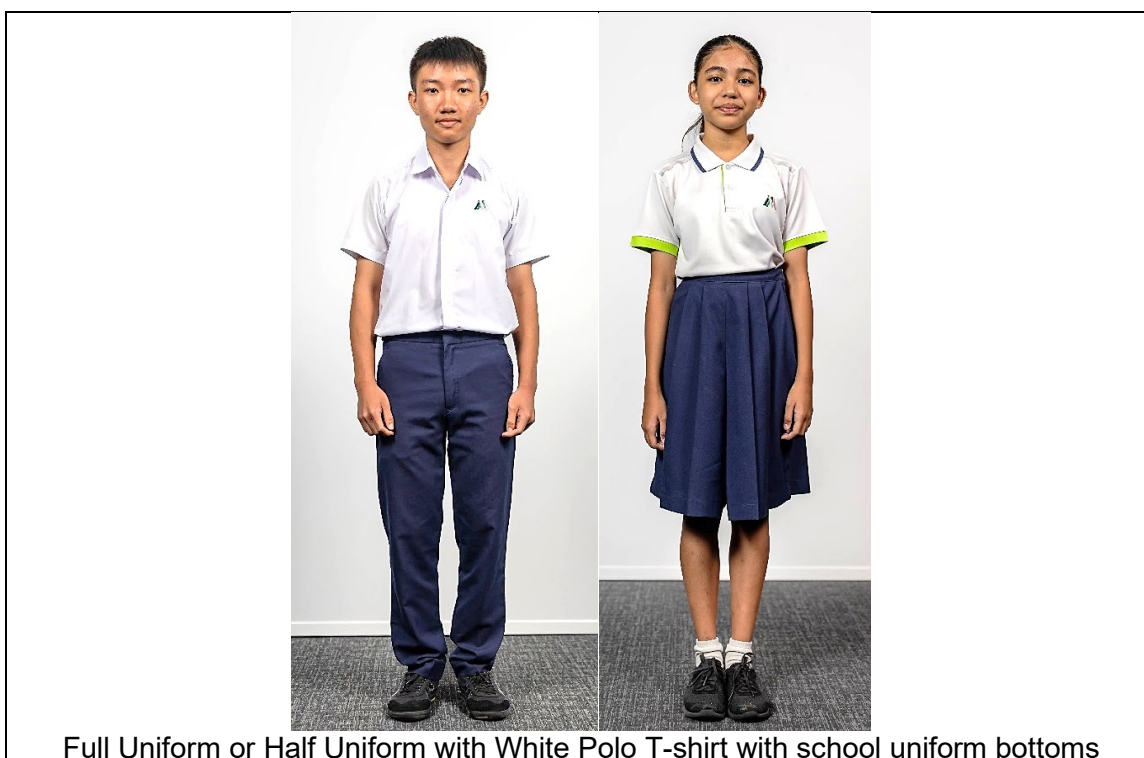
<b>SCHOOL ATTIRE</b>
Students must wear full or half uniform (i.e., White Polo T-shirt with school uniform shorts/pants/culottes) with <b>shirts/T-shirts tucked in</b> . No PE shorts to be worn.

Students may wear low-cut sports shoes with laces, provided they are not in flashy colours. Students must wear plain white socks that are **visible and cover the ankle joints**.

## Punctuality

### 5.2

To help students to develop a sense of responsibility, all students must report punctually to school as well as lessons. Students who are not present with their respective classes at the Flag Raising Ceremony venue by 7.30am will be considered **late** for school.

Students are also required to report to lessons on time when there is a switch of venues between lessons.

## School policy on use of mobile phones and possession of other expensive items

### 5.3

To provide a conducive learning environment for the students, we strongly discourage students from bringing electronic devices, smart watches or other expensive items to school. In particular, handphones are a great source of distraction for students in the classrooms.

The use of smart gadgets (e.g. smartphones/smart watches) is **NOT allowed during school hours, including recess, CCA and after school programmes** (e.g. supplementary/enrichment/remedial lesson). Students found to infringe this rule may have their phones confiscated by the teacher for the day.

Students are required to place their mobile phones in their lockers before the start of the first lesson. All mobile phones are to be switched off and/ or turned to silent mode. They may collect their phones from their lockers at the end of their last school activity for the day. For emergencies, parents/guardians are advised to call the school General Office at 65831387. Please provide the name and class of your child so that we can act on the information. For non-emergency cases, please leave a message to their child/ward's mobile phone for them to call after school dismissal.



In the event of loss of electronic devices or other expensive items due to students' negligence, the school shall not be held responsible.

### Road Safety

- 5.4 For the safety of our students and other road users, we would like to remind parents/guardians who drive the students to school of the following:

- Not to stop their vehicles directly in front of the school gates or too close to the traffic light when alighting or picking-up passengers.
- To co-operate with the security guards and staff who are directing the traffic by following their instructions
- Slow down your vehicle as the speed limit within the school compound is 10 km/h.
- In light of ongoing roadworks around the vicinity of the school and Pasir Ris, we urge all students and parents / guardians / visitors to school to take extra precautions when using the pedestrian crossings and walkways.

### Advisory for cyclists

- 5.5 If your child is cycling to school, he/she should wear a protective helmet, demonstrate competency in safe cycling and is aware of the cycling rules.

### Use of lockers

- 5.6 Form Teachers will assign each student a locker (internal dimension: 15x26X40mm) on the first day of school. The use of lockers is provided free of charge. Students are expected to use the lockers in a responsible manner in accordance to school rules in the *Student Handbook*.

***As a welcome gift, Sec 1 students will be presented with a number lock for securing the locker assigned to them on the first day of school.***

## **7 Student Administrative Matters**

### **7.1 Verification of Student Details Report**

A PG will be sent to you at the start of the year requesting your assistance to verify the information of your child/ward's in the online Student Details Report (SDR). Your submission should be made via PG (Parents Gateway) app by **16 Jan (Fri)**. If there are any changes (medical, contact info) to be made after the submission, please approach the





Form Teacher for assistance. If there is a change in your contact number or email address in the course of the year, please promptly update the information in PG. This updated information is important for the school especially during emergencies. Please do not hesitate to contact the school for assistance.

## 7.2 Use of photos/ videos for publicity purposes

Throughout your child's journey at Meridian, photographs or video images of your child/ ward may be taken during school activities and events such as classroom lessons, CCAs, school camps, or school concerts. The school may use and publish such photographs or video recordings in school publications, the school's website, social media channels, or other communication channels. ## 8 Student Health and Well-being Matters

### 8.1 HPV Vaccinations for Girls

The HPV vaccine helps to protect females against cervical cancer, which is caused by HPV infection. HPV vaccination is now offered as a school-based programme for our female students and is free of charge. Consent from parents is required for this vaccination. The HPV vaccination for Sec 1 girls will be held on 14 and 15 Jul. More details will be sent via PG nearer the date.

### 8.2 Annual Health Screening

The annual health screening, conducted by Health Promotion Board, will be held at the school for Sec 1 students. The annual health screening will be held from 7 to 13 Jul. More details will be sent via PG nearer the date.

### 8.3 Temperature-Taking Exercise (ATTEx) – 1 Apr (Wed)

The ATTEx is conducted twice yearly and aims to:

- a. maintain schools' preparedness to re-activate the attendance and temperature-taking regime should the need arise; and
- b. educate students on personal responsibility for their own health and social responsibility.

The first ATTEx will be conducted on 1 Apr immediately after the morning flag-raising ceremony. All students are to bring their own working Oral Digital Thermometers (ODT) on that day
